Who is eligible for these services ?

Aleph is a Jewish agency which provides programs to anyone Jewish, regardless of their observance or affiliation. However we do not turn away anyone seeking help.

Is there something that we can do in prison?

Inmates and their families are encouraged to write to Aleph before their release, to help coordinate the release. Aleph will work with local half way houses and with the institutions to help provide a smooth transition.

Who will help me navigate the system when I get out?

Aleph will assign you with a mentor who will work with you and help you navigate the system. These mentors are trained and are have basic knowledge of the many available resources and are in contact and coached by community experts (Jewish Family & Children's Services).

After contacting Aleph what should I do?

Recognize you are a child of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and can achieve the greatest heights. Its up to you!

What Do We Do?

The Aleph Institute provides welcome relief for incarcerated Jewish men and women, their families, and those re-entering society from prisons. Jewish prisoners and their families have traditionally been forgotten by society at large, and especially neglected by the Jewish community where the number of incarcerated is significantly smaller than the jailed portion of the mainstream population. The Aleph Institute advocates for the imprisoned Jewish population, believing that they too are an integral part of the Jewish community. Aleph provides a holistic approach to caring for men and women during and post incarceration and working with their families.
