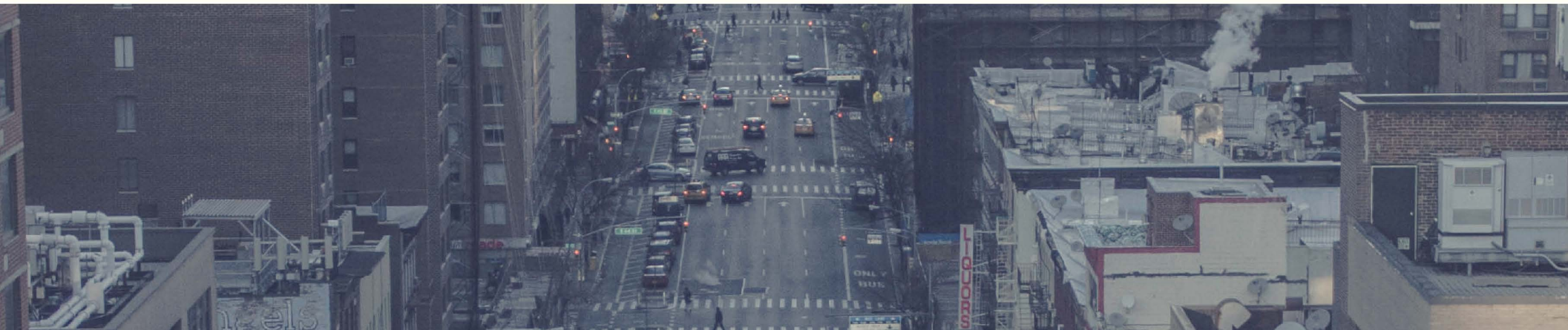

Program Requirements

- Participants must show remorse for his/her past behavior and sincere interest and motivation to become a better, more productive individual.
- Participants must be ready to work with community/faith leader to change for the better.
- Participant must be willing to be in the program for 18 months and agree to comply with program requirements.

Rehabilitative tools, make for a more productive individual and a safer, healthier society

The Participants will agree to:

- A) Weekly meetings with his or her pastor/rabbi/lay leader, designed to lead the participant toward a more meaningful and reformed life, avoiding actions that are associated with destructive behavior.
- B) Community service weekly, at a local non-profit, with the goal of being a productive member of society.
- C) Employment retention, although a challenging feat during the pre-sentencing stage, due to uncertainty about the future. However, the participant will meet with career counseling agencies with the goal of obtaining employment.
- D) Working with a mentor who can provide support, guidance and direction.
- E) Meeting monthly with the ASP program leader who oversees the progress of the program and provides monthly reports on each participant to the court.
